- The Ela Area Public Library District is located in Lake County. The Library District covers almost all of the Villages of Lake Zurich, Kildeer, and Hawthorn Woods; plus portions of North Barrington, Long Grove, and unincorporated areas
- The population of the Library District as of 2020 census is 36,366
- The Library currently has 99 employees (not including board members)
- Our annual budget for FY25 is \$7,510,321.92
- Our Library's equalized assessed valuation (EAV) for 2024 is \$2,154,648,605

What Have We Done Well? (2011-2023)

- 2011: Two state-of-the-art Digital Media Labs are constructed on the 2nd floor.
- 2014: The Children's Department is remodeled, with interactive play spaces, front-facing bookshelves, and spaces for families to gather. 2nd floor Study Rooms are renovated.
- 2015: The Library opens Forge, a makerspace for patrons to build, invent, tinker, learn and create.
- 2018: Library pays off "mortgage" on the building. The final bond payment is made in December.
- 2019: Dinosaur Discoveries exhibit opens, drawing record numbers of visitors
- 2023: New Children's meeting room & service desk; new materials sorter; new 2nd floor conference room; revamped team spaces.

What Can We Do Better or More Efficiently?

- Investigate alternative energy options including electric car charging stations.
- Explore ways to best utilize outdoor space opportunities.
- Transition to ACH payment system.
- Update targeted spaces to reflect current uses and needs of taxpayers.
