Our two new conference rooms have been in high demand – we're delighted to have Rotary, the Chamber of Commerce, and other community groups regularly making use of our public spaces. Improved workspaces in the back offices means you won't have to wait as long when checking out a fishing pole or cake pan – Library of Things storage is now easily accessible by Circulation Department staff.

We're grateful to our construction management firm Lamp, Inc., for completing the project on time and under budget. Please stop by and let us know what you think.

We're sad to say goodbye to longtime Trustee Cindy Blank. Since 2011, Cindy has worked hard, including stints as president and treasurer, to eliminate Library fines; approve building improvements including the Forge, Digital Media Labs, revamped Children's spaces, and 2023 remodel; save taxpayer money by paying the building's bonds off early; approve the dinosaur exhibit; and master our financial reports during the switch from cash to accrual accounting. Tax-Aide Wraps Up Another Successful & Busy Tax Season at EAPL

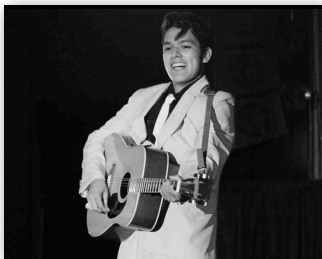
This year's partnership with AARP Tax-Aide provided tax support to almost 400 residents in our community! Here are a few stats from the past season.

- Eighteen tax-aide volunteers processed 356 tax returns over the three-month period.
- Of the 400 residents who used EAPL's Tax-Aide service, approximately 25% of those taxpayers were new.
- Geographically, the returns prepared at the Library encompassed over 59 zip codes in the area. A majority of those taxpayers were located in Lake Zurich, Long Grove, Hawthorn Woods, Kildeer, Forest Lake, Wauconda, Barrington and Lake Barrington.
